#### THE BROAD MEANING OF TU B'SHEVAT

This year we celebrate Tu B'Shevat on February 13, 2025. This holiday is referred to as the "New Year of

the Trees." It occurs, as the name of the holiday indicates, on the 15th of the Hebrew month Shevat. Frequently referred to as the Jewish Arbor Day, it began as an agricultural festival and announced the arrival of Spring. This season marks the period where the earliest blooming trees in Eretz Yisrael wake up from their "winter sleep" and begin their fruit bearing cycle. Celebrations include planting trees as well as a Tu B'Shevat seder that incorporates wines of different hues, olives, pomegranates, almonds, dates, figs, etc. Many joyous songs are sung to honor this holiday.

In its broader context, Tu B'Shevat is also a celebration of the environment. The value of trees assists with irrigation, shade, an important food source, the life cycle, and strength.

From The Museum of Jewish Heritage in New York City's website:

Tu B'Shevat is a time to celebrate and nurture The Children's Tree. The story of this tree is one of connection, blooming, and possibility.

In January 1943, a group of young Jewish children detained in Theresienstadt planted a tree in celebration of Tu B'Shevat with the help of their teacher, Irma Lauscher. The children took care of and nurtured the tree, using a portion of their collective water rations to keep the tree alive. Only two hundred of the 15,000 Jewish children imprisoned in Theresienstadt survived the Holocaust. Those who lived placed a sign on the tree proclaiming, "As the branches of this tree, so the branches of our people!"

Since the end of the war, saplings from the original tree in Theresienstadt are located in cities around the world, including Chicago, Philadelphia, San Francisco, New York City and Jerusalem. These cities are considered part of the "Global Tree Network." There is a commitment to care for these saplings for generations to come, honoring the children and keeping their memory alive. The concept of a "Tree of Life" is never more empowering than the commitment to honor the children of Theresienstadt and extend their legacy.

Etz cha-yim hi l'ma-cha-zi-kim ba, v'tom che-ha m'u-shar.

It is a tree of life to those that hold fast to it and all of its supporters are happy.

Shalom Dear Friends,

According to our calendar, this month we celebrate the Jewish festival of Tu B'Shevat. The name of this festival is actually its date (like the 4th of July): "Tu" is a pronunciation of the Hebrew letters for the number 15, and it falls in the Hebrew month of Shevat.

Fruit trees were awarded special status in the Torah because of their importance in sustaining life and as a symbol of G-d's divine favor. Even during times of war, G-d warns the Israelites, "When in your war against a city you have to besiege it a long time in order to capture it, you must not destroy its trees... Are trees of the field human to withdraw before you into the besieged city? Only trees that you know do not yield food may be destroyed" (Deuteronomy 20:19-20).

This year, Tu B'Shevat is celebrated on February 12. In modern times, Tu B'Shevat has become a symbol of both Zionist attachment to Israel as well as an example of Jewish sensitivity to the environment. Early Zionist settlers to Israel began planting new trees not only to restore the ecology of ancient Israel, but as a symbol of renewed growth of the Jewish people returning to their ancestral homeland. While relatively few Jews continue to observe the kabbalistic Tu B'Shevat seder, many American and European Jews observe Tu B'Shevat by contributing money to the Jewish National Fund, an organization devoted to reforesting Israel.

For environmentalists, Tu B'Shevat is an ancient and authentic Jewish "Earth Day", or Arbor Day that educates Jews about the Jewish tradition's advocacy of responsible stewardship of G-d's creation as manifested in ecological activism. Among them, contemporary versions of the Tu B'Shevat seder, emphasizing environmentalist concerns, are gaining popularity.

Plant a tree, be ecologically more mindful - let's do what we can to leave the earth better than we found it!

#### **RECIPE CORNER**

#### CHERRY KUGEL FOR GEORGE WASHINGTON

- 1 can cherry pie filling
- 12 ounces wide egg noodles
- 6 large eggs
- 1 cup sour cream
- 8 ounces cottage cheese (1 cup)
- 4 ounces cream cheese, softened
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 tsp. vanilla
- 1 tsp. ground cinnamon
- ½ cup raisins or craisins, if desired

Place a rack in the middle of your oven and preheat to 350 degrees F. Bring a large pot of water to a boil. Add the noodles to the pot, bring back to a boil, and let them cook until tender (not overly soft), about 5 minutes. Drain.

In a large bowl, mix together the eggs, sour cream, cottage cheese, cream cheese, sugar, vanilla and cinnamon. Add the cooked noodles and stir until well combined. Add can of cherry pie filling and stir until blended.

Spray a 9x13 inch baking dish with nonstick cooking oil. Pour the noodle mixture into the dish. Bake the kugel for about 60 minutes, turning once halfway through cooking, till the center of the kugel is set and the tips of the noodles turn golden brown. Remove from the oven. Let the kugel rest for 15-20 minutes before slicing. Kugel can be served warm or cold.

#### JIMMY CARTER

"It has been 2,000 years since there has been peace between Egypt and a free Jewish nation," President Jimmy Carter told a joint session of Congress on September 18, 1978 as he presented them with the Camp David Accords."

He noted that each of the three negotiators were of different religions.

"The world prayed for success of this effort and I am glad to announce that our prayers have been answered."

Menachem Begin, President of Israel, stated that the agreements should not be known as the Camp David Accords, but as the Jimmy Carter Accords. All three negotiators revealed that they had each worked almost all day and all night during their talks. Begin drew laughter with his comment that the Jews worked harder on the Accords than their forefathers did in building the pyramids.

Egypt President Anwar Sadat and Begin won the 1978 Nobel Peace Prize for negotiating the Accords. Carter won the 2002 Nobel Peace Prize for his lifelong efforts to improve conditions of human life. For the past 40 years, Egypt and Israel have been living with peaceful relations.

Let this be our tribute to former President Jimmy Carter, who died a few weeks ago at age 100.



#### **TU B'SHAVAT**

The holiday Tu B'shavat (ט"ו בשבט) is an arboreal celebration also known as Rosh Hashanah La'llanot, literally "New Year of the Trees." In contemporary Israel, the day is recognized as an ecological awareness day, and trees are planted in celebration. It is a reminder of our interdependence with nature and our responsibility to be active stewards of our Earth. What was historically considered a minor holiday, the message of Tu B'shavat has garnered greater significance as the crisis of climate change shapes the world.

The holiday occurs annually on the 15th day of the Hebrew month of Shevat.

Tu B'shavat is not mentioned in the Torah. Scholars believe the holiday was originally an agricultural festival, corresponding to the beginning of spring in Israel. But after the destruction of the Second Temple in 70 C.E. and the exile that followed, many of the exiled Jews felt a need to bind themselves symbolically to their former homeland. Tu B'shavat served, in part, to fill that spiritual need — a sort of physical association with the land.

In the 16th century, the Kabbalists (mystics) of Tzfat (the city of Safed) created a new ritual to celebrate Tu Bishvat called the Feast of Fruits. Modeled on the <u>Passover</u> seder, participants would read selections from the Hebrew Bible and Rabbinic literature, and would eat fruits and nuts traditionally associated with the land of Israel: wheat, grapes, barley, figs, pomegranates, olives, and dates.

Other than plant trees and eat fruit, there are symbolic ways to observe the holiday, such as picking fresh fruits and vegetables at a local farm, starting an herb garden, building a birdhouse to hang in a tree, and even organizing a park clean-up to collect litter.




