CANTOR'S CORNER

As you are reading this article, no doubt you are aware that Pesach is coming and that there are numerous preparations necessary for doing it "right." For those of us living in Silver Spring and close-by suburbs, virtually everything we might need for our sedarim is readily available at both the kosher and public supermarkets. Get away from major metropolitan areas, and that ease in finding Pesach supplies can disappear fast. We learned that the hard way about ten years ago. Cheryl and I had purchased a timeshare in Kissimmee, Florida (outside of Orlando) for use during Rachel's spring break from Montgomery County Public Schools. Our first year using the timeshare in April fell during Pesach, and given the fact that we have a number of friends who live in the Orlando area, some of whom had NEVER been to a seder before, it seemed like a perfect opportunity to invite our guests to our timeshare to celebrate with us. I packed a seder plate, haggadot I thought would be accessible to non-Jews, kippot for the men and figured we'd get everything else in Florida. I checked out kosher markets online and found that there was only one and it was about 25 miles away from the timeshare. But, it was billed as a "kosher supermarket" able to provide for "all of your Passover needs." So, I figured "you're on vacation - go with the flow." I called several weeks prior to the trip and ordered a brisket, turkey and a few other items. I asked about kosher-for-Passover cakes and was told that they would be there and there would be plenty to choose from. So, I didn't give it another thought. We'd arrive in Florida with time to spare to get ready for the first night's seder.

I drove to the "supermarket" on the Sunday before the Monday evening seder. I had my Mapquest directions which I followed to the letter, and those directions took me to a strip mall. I drove around the strip mall looking at numbers, but I couldn't match the address I had to anything that looked remotely like a supermarket. So, I parked the car, got out and walked. I found the "supermarket." It was the size of a country general store with an identifying sign outside so small that it was

difficult to spot even though I was looking for it. I walked inside and met the proprietor. He had the brisket and turkey I had ordered and it's a good thing I had called in advance because there was NO meat available to purchase on the spot. I took a look at the cakes he had for Pesach. I had expected to find fresh, artistic creations. What I found were prepackaged loaf cakes that were shipped in for Passover. Shipped in from where? BALTIMORE! I asked where else I could find supplies for Passover. He said that I might find some things at supermarkets like PUBLIX but it would not be like what I was used to at home. I didn't believe him, but it turned out he was right. I went to several different supermarkets and found the supplies for Passover skimpy at best. The biggest shock came when I went to the produce section of each supermarket looking for a horseradish root and was told, with a look of bewilderment on the face of each clerk I asked "oh, we don't carry that here" as if to ask "why would you even want that?" So, I found a bottle of Tulkoff's grated horseradish, and on Monday night, it was one of a number of ways we improvised from how we would have handled things had we been home in Silver Spring.

Our guests certainly didn't know the difference. Each one was thrilled to have been invited to our seder, and one of our non-Jewish guests told us of an experience he and his wife had had some years earlier. Their host at that seder had expected them to sing the Passover songs at the end of the seder with just a little prompting prior to singing them. His recollection of his seder experience had been one of angst and discomfort. This seder was, for him, a much more enjoyable and meaningful experience. And I have to say, that even though it was a nuisance not being able to find everything we needed, we found a way to make things go. Yes, ingenuity was alive and well, and it was an important reminder that when things don't go exactly as expected, sometimes you just have to improvise. Our ancestors coming out of Egypt would have understood completely.

May all be well with each of you. Be of good health and Chag Sameach!

Donate Food for the Needy; Tech Day with JDS Students

Leisure World Joins the Greater Washington community, along with hundreds of thousands of volunteers from around the world, in a day of service on April 2. Two projects will be observed here in Leisure World. The first is the annual collection of food for the needy and homeless in Clubhouse I. The second is a return of the Jewish Day School students to coach our seniors about current communication and computer technology in Clubhouse II.

Sponsored by Na'Amat, volunteers will be manning a table in Clubhouse I to collect containers of food for donation to MANNA. Residents are urged to take a few cans, jars or cartons of food or a monetary donation to the Clubhouse during the hours starting at 10:00 am until 1:00 pm. Chair of the event is Gladys Blank, Na'Amat.

This is the fourth year that Leisure World has participated in good Deeds Day with donations to MANNA to feed the needy as its goal. Here in our region it is organized by the Jewish Federation of Greater Washington with support from a broad range of interfaith and social oriented organizations.

Technology Support will take place in the Computer Center and Activities Room in Clubhouse II. This event is co-sponsored by the Center for Lifelong Learning and the Computer Learning Center. I AM SADDENED, I AM ANGRY, I AM OUTRAGED!

As I write this, there have been 135 incidents so far this year. One hundred and thirty-five incidents of hate crimes against the Jews of this wonderful country. There have been one hundred and thirty-five threats against our synagogues and community centers and schools.

Students have had to be evacuated from classes and buildings. Synagogue officials have arrived at their buildings to find anonymous threats on the phones. Our buildings have been defaced with hate messages and swastikas. Parents are afraid to send their young children to religious school.

Why is this happening?

I am sad. I am so saddened about the whole thing. We saw this happening in Europe in the 1930s and thought it would never happen in our Country. Not in the United States. Not here! What has happened here to encourage this type of hateful behavior?

I am angry. How dare those anti-Semitics act like this? Cowardly. Words sprayed on buildings in the night. Phone threats called in when no one is there to receive the threat. Afraid to be seen or heard in public, but instead, acting like verminscurrying away in daylight.

I am outraged. Where is the indignant reaction of our wonderful American friends? One hundred and thirty-five hate incidents buried on the inside pages of our newspapers, if mentioned at all. Maybe a small mention on the television news. Where is the outcry from the leaders of the other religions? From our leaders, our government? What will it take to make people notice and react? Do they want to wait until a building full of Jews is bombed? Will the killing of 100 innocent people shake them up? How about 50? How about 25? What will it take to open their eyes to what is happening here, in our Democracy, in our 'freedom of religion' United States?

I am saddened. I am angry. I am outraged.

ABOUT OUR HISTORY

Ralph Shapiro, a member of JRLW, is an expert in the history of our people. He has published a book, **Jewish History** *4,000 Years of Accomplishment, Agony and Survival*, on the subject. I hope you will enjoy this new feature, Don't hesitate to let us hear your opinion about this new feature. Here goes:

God did not permit the biblical Prophet Moses to get to the Promised Land of Israel Why? How close did he get?

While wandering in the desert after leaving Egypt, the Israelites led by Moses and Aaron guestioned God's good intentions for them because there was no water for them. God instructed Moses to speak to a rock and water would flow. Moses and Aaron didn't believe this would happen so God instructed Moses to strike the rock with a stick, and water flowed. God punished both of these leaders for this disbelief in God's capability and indicated he would not permit them to enter the Promised Land. Aaron died in the desert on the way to Palestine. Years later, as they got near to the Promised Land, Moses went up to a high mountain top, Mt. Nebo, on the east side of the Dead Sea, which was not to be Israeli country. He could see westward to the ocean and the main areas in-between to be Israel, and could see far northward to the top of Mt. Herman which was beyond the land to be Israeli. While there, Moses died according to God's earlier plan for Moses' death and Moses was given the Jewish 30-day mourning period respect. His burial place was not recorded in the Bible and is unknown.

RECIPE CORNER

AUNT HELEN'S PASSOVER NUT CAKE

This recipe was handed down by my husband's Aunt Helen, who was a fabulous cook. She oversaw the kitchen at the Friedman's Hotel, a kosher, family resort in the Poconos. The recipe takes some effort, but the results are well worth it.

Ingredients:

10 eggs, separated1 cup ground walnuts1 3/4 cups sugar1 cup cake mealgrated rind of one lemonjuice of one lemon and 1/2 cup water

Directions:

Separate eggs and allow to come to room temperature. Meanwhile, measure cake meal, chopped nuts and sugar. Grate lemon rind. Squeeze the lemon juice and add to 1/2 cup water. Line 10" tube pan with waxed paper. Beat egg yolks until pale yellow, adding sugar 1/4 cup at a time while the yolks are being beaten. Beat egg whites until stiff. Add cake meal, nuts, lemon rind and liquid to the beaten egg yolk/sugar mixture. Add a few spoonfuls of the beaten egg whites to this mixture and then fold the mixture carefully into the egg whites. Using a spatula, pour batter into the prepared tube pan. Batter will be thick. Place pan on middle rack of preheated 350° oven. Bake for 45 minutes, checking cake at 30 minutes. Cool on rack.
